She is visiting all the merchants on Bridge Street to see if they will plant, care for, or want to be involved. She has blue buckets that could be used or the barrels that are in some areas already. It was suggested that some organizations might want to adopt a planter or help with the park by City Market.

Hotchkiss is Happening has moved to the 2nd Saturday in May for the Sheep Dog Trials. There will be art demonstrations and other activities in many of the businesses in the afternoon. It was suggested that the museum might have something in the afternoon as well. The Chamber board voted earlier in the year to provide \$300 to the Downtown Merchants Committee to help with promotion for the first few months.
